Book Changing Day

Coats

Each child will need a coat in school everyday as we do indoor and outdoor lessons.

Jewellery

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery at school. If they have their ears pierced they are only allowed to wear studs and these must be removed on PE days.

PE

Our PE day is still on a Wednesday. Children need to have their earrings removed before they come to school. To assist with getting changed please could your child wear socks and not tights.

Attendance

We believe that good attendance at school should start in the Early Years. To encourage this we will be continuing to celebrating weekly 100% attendance every Friday. Children who have attended all week will continue to receive a certificate and choose a small prize. Please could we remind you that if someone different is collecting your child, please inform staff at the door or the office.

Please could we remind you that we still require a weekly contribution of 50p to put towards a wide variety of snacks including yogurts, bread sticks, cheese biscuits and other special items such as for cooking, baking and food tasting.
