














### Things to remember!

#### CHILDREN ARRIVING LATE FOR SCHOOL:

There seems to be a lot of children arriving late for school every day. May we remind you that the gates close at 8.45am, all children should arrive by this time. Being late for school every day not only means your child is missing out on valuable learning time, but it disrupts the other children who have arrived in time for School. Being late also means your child misses out on 100% attendance rewards and class attendance.

### **PERSISTENT ABSENTEES:**

Pupils with attendance of 90% and below are called Persistent Absentees and are subject to rigorous monitoring. We will not routinely authorise absence for these pupils. If their attendance does not improve by working with school, they will be referred to the Education Welfare Services and further action will be taken.

Please take a look at our website on attendance just to remind yourselves of what is authorised and unauthorised as you can see, we have a lot unauthorised absence this is not good and needs to improve.
