


Mental Health Day

Unfortunately, Times Table Rockstars usage has slipped across the first half of the Spring term.

Learning your times tables at home as well as in school is so important as they are an essential building block in math, opening the door to multi digit multiplication when children reach years 4, 5 and 6. Not only will they help to speed up mental arithmetic, making it easier and faster to recall, but working out times tables in the head helps with confidence in numbers and in turn, confidence in being able to tackle more difficult mathematical questions.

The classes with the most engagement are years,3, 4 and 6 however there needs to be an improvement across all year groups– all children should participate for at least 30 minuets a day.
