Important Notice

I would like to inform you of an important change regarding school access that will take effect after the Easter break. From the start of the new term, the only entrance to the school will be via Derby Street. The gate on Coalpool Lane will be closed and no longer in use.

This decision has not been made lightly. I would like to thank all parents who took the time to share their thoughts through our recent parent survey. Your feedback was carefully considered as part of the decision – making process. I would also like to thank the councillors who attended a meeting to discuss this.

While I understand that a small number of families are not in agreement with this change, the safeguarding of my pupils and staff remains my highest priority. Limiting access to one secure entrance allows us to manage who is coming onto the school grounds more effectively, which is essential for the welfare of all children.

Two common concerns raised were the longer walking distance and the condition of the footpath. The gates are approximately 0.4 miles apart. We kindly ask that family's adjust their routines accordingly to ensure children arrive at school on time, as our school start and finish times remain unchanged. A reminder that our breakfast club is available everyday from 8am to children from Reception to Year 6.

Regarding the littered footpaths, these are maintained by the local council. I have reported the issue and raised it with our local councillors. If you are concerned about the area surrounding the school, please note that these matters should be directed to the council via their website, where issues can be logged .

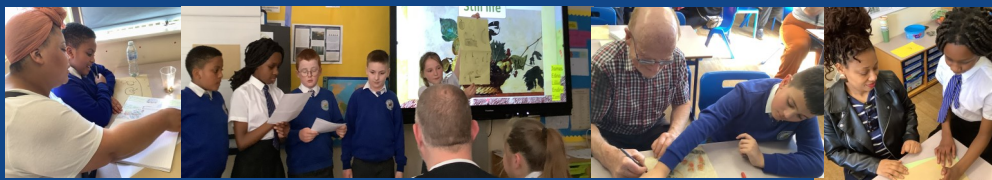
I appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we continue to put the safety and wellbeing of our children first.
