Year 3 Visit the National Stone Centre

The National Stone Centre is a 40-acre site on the edge of the Peak District featuring 330 million-year-old geological formations. The visit perfectly complemented their science topic on rocks and soils, bringing classroom learning to life in a hands -on and memorable way.

The children began the day exploring the ancient rock formations that make the site so special. They were amazed to discover that some of the fossils they handled were over 330 million years old - a remarkable window into the Earth's distant past! Guided by expert staff, the pupils learned how rocks such as limestone and chalk were formed, and how they have been used by people for thousands of years. They also examined how fossils are created and what they can tell us about prehistoric life.

One of the highlights of the trip was the chance to pan for gold and precious gems. The children thoroughly enjoyed getting their hands wet and searching for glittering treasures in the water troughs. There was lots of excitement and teamwork as they compared their finds and identified different minerals.

Throughout the day, pupils asked thoughtful questions, shared their knowledge, and showed great curiosity about the natural world. The trip not only strengthened their understanding of geology but also inspired a real enthusiasm for science and discovery.

Everyone returned to school tired but happy, full of stories to share and new knowledge to build upon in their next lessons. It was truly a day to remember!
